Financial support guidelines for aspiring preschool teachers

QualifySA in Early Childhood

Financial support for individuals undertaking qualifications in early childhood education and care aims to reduce barriers, enabling individuals from diverse backgrounds to pursue rewarding careers.

This program seeks to amplify opportunities for individuals to enter and thrive in the early childhood education and care field, fostering equality, building our workforce and enhancing the quality of care and education provided to children.

About the program

The QualifySA in Early Childhood program offers financial support to South Australian residents who have received a letter of offer or an enrolment confirmation to an eligible birth to 5 (B-5) early childhood teaching qualification. * Eligible financial support recipients can use the funding to offset living expenses while they study and work. Expenses may include course fees, study materials, or accommodation costs required to facilitate studies.

The following financial support is available under this program:

- up to \$25,000 for recipients studying a B-5 bachelor degree
- up to \$17,000 for recipients studying a B-5 master degree**
- up to \$14,500 for recipients studying a B-5 graduate diploma***.

All qualifications must be recognised by the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) on the approved qualifications list.

All amounts listed are before tax.





All applicants should intend to work in a South Australian early childhood service specifically working with 3-year-old children upon completion of their qualification. Early childhood services include long day care services providing a preschool program, and non-government and government run sessional preschools.

Funding is not available for teachers who intend or continue to work at a primary or secondary school.

Applicants must complete their qualification by **31 December 2032**.

Successful applicants will be required to contractually commit to working in a preschool program as a teacher South Australia's early childhood sector after graduation for a minimum of 2 years.

- *Further eligibility requirements apply as outlined under the Eligibility heading.
- **Students studying a research master degree are not eligible for this financial support program.
- **Eligible master degree students must not already have an early childhood career qualification recognised by ACECQA.
- ***Graduate diploma students must possess an existing primary or secondary degree that is <u>not</u> recognised by ACECQA as an approved early childhood education and care qualification.

Eligibility

To be eligible for QualifySA in Early Childhood funding support, an applicant must be a South Australian resident AND:

- a citizen of Australian or New Zealand or hold a permanent resident of Australia visa AND
- have an offer to study an <u>eligible birth to 5 (B-5) early childhood teaching qualification recognised by</u> ACECQA.

If the program receives more applications than it can accommodate, preference will be given to specific cohorts such as:

- educators in rural and regional areas
- those in metropolitan services with a significant number of vulnerable or disadvantaged children
- educators who have not yet benefited from financial support or incentives provided by the Office for Early Childhood Development or another funding source.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples – financial support

Financial support of up to \$34,000 is being offered to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students who have received a letter of offer or enrolled in eligible early childhood birth to 5 teaching qualifications. Eligibility criteria and conditions apply.

Regional and remote students – additional financial support

Students in regional and remote areas who face additional barriers to accessing higher education can apply for the Grow Your Own (GYO) allowance. This GYO financial support program provides up to \$10,000 over the course of a recipient's studies to help them pursue their education, and to build a career in their local region. This funding is in addition to the support offered through the QualifySA in Early Childhood financial support program.

To be eligible for GYO funding, students must:

- be recipients of financial support through the QualifySA in Early Childhood financial support program
- reside in, and intend to work within a local regional or remote community, specifically in locations classified as very remote, remote, or outer regional in South Australia according to the <u>Australian</u> <u>Statistical Geography Standard – Remoteness Area classification.</u>

Eligibility will be determined by the administrator based on your residential address.

Funding information

- Applicants should have already been accepted into an eligible course, and all funding is contingent
 on the student submitting satisfactory evidence of enrolment and study completion for each year of
 their study.
- Students receive payments per academic year, adjusted for recognition of prior learning (RPL), other
 reductions in course duration, or completed subjects/units of study prior to being approved to receive
 financial support.
- For the purposes of the funding application, a part-time student must be studying a minimum 0.5 load. This is half of what is considered to be a full-time load by your institution. To calculate this, you will need to confirm the number of units or points your institution deems as full-time and halve that number.
- If your study extends beyond the standard duration of time for expected completion due to circumstances such as studying part-time, not passing subjects, withdrawing, or other considerations (such as completing a 3-year course over 5 years), the timing of your scheduled payments will be adjusted.
- Applicants must complete the qualification by 31 December 2032.
- Applicants should intend to work in a South Australian early childhood service specifically working
 with 3-year-old children upon completion of their qualifications. This includes working in long day
 care services providing a preschool program, and non-government and government run sessional
 preschools.
- A funding recipient will be required to contractually commit to working in a preschool program as a teacher in the South Australian early childhood sector after graduation for a minimum of 2 years.
- Eligibility for employment retention payments extends to both fixed-term and ongoing roles in the South Australian early childhood sector.





Considerations before applying

- Applicants must assess their financial situation, as they are responsible for additional expenses beyond the awarded amount.
- Funding amounts are pre-tax, and recipients must seek independent advice on potential impacts on taxation and government benefit schemes.

Applications, assessment, and funding recipient obligations

- Applications for this program are submitted online.
- Applications are assessed by an external administrator, in accordance with the eligibility criteria.
- Upon approval, successful candidates sign a legally binding funding agreement outlining their rights and responsibilities.
- Financial support is disbursed based on milestone conditions to be met by the recipient, with potential repayment obligations for non-compliance.

Employment retention payments and milestone non-compliance

- After completing their approved course, a financial support recipient may qualify for retention payments upon commencing employment in the South Australian early childhood sector.
- Employment should begin within 6 months of graduation, whether in a fixed term or ongoing role.
- A recipient is required to maintain continuous employment working in a preschool program that
 meets the specified criteria outlined in the financial support agreement to retain eligibility for
 payments.
- Financial support recipients must promptly report changes in employment status, conditions, or location to the administrator to continue receiving retention milestone payments. This includes when circumstances change due to a variation in employment contract, or in the case of periods of parental leave.

It is the funding recipient's responsibility to find employment in South Australia to meet the program milestones. The Office for Early Childhood Development does not guarantee employment in the early childhood sector.

If a financial support recipient fails to meet prescribed milestones, they may be required to repay some funding. In exceptional circumstances, the Office for Early Childhood Development may consider waiving repayment obligations, subject to individual evaluation and supporting documentation.

QualifySA in Early Childhood – financial support payment milestones

The tables below show the financial support payment milestones. Recipients will receive these payments after they provide the evidence needed for each milestone. The evidence needed is described in the financial support agreement and is checked by the administrator.
